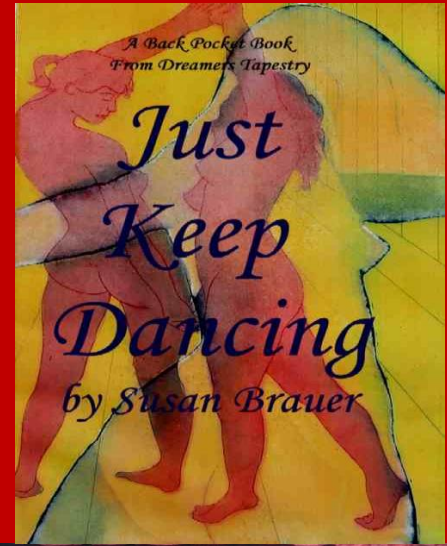


Stop the Violence is a FCCLA national program that empowers youth with attitudes, skills, and resources in order to recognize, report, and reduce youth violence.
